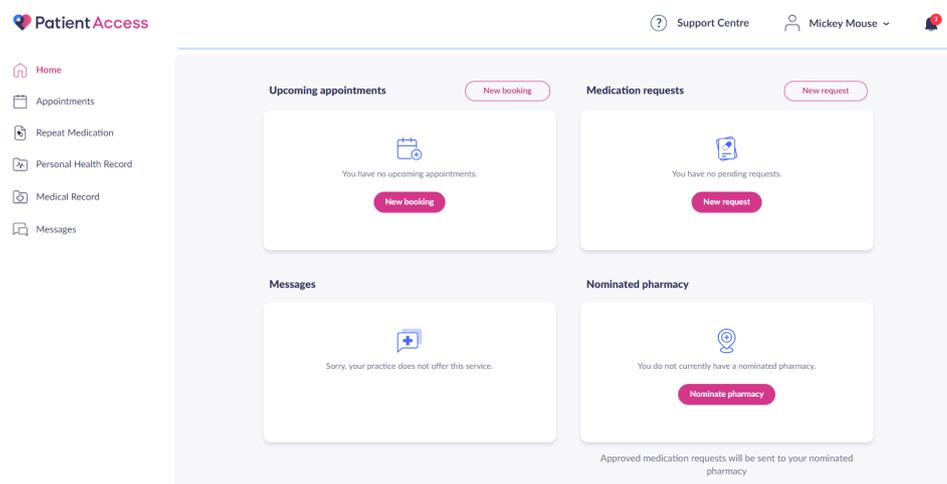
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## Patient Access

You may have noticed a new version of Patient Access. This version brings a redesigned user experience, simplified registration and sign-in, support for EPS pharmacy nominations and an all-new self-serve support site. Once you have logged in to the Service once, you will be able to then verify your email address and mobile number, allowing you to then log in using your email address rather than your User ID. You will be able to quickly recover and reset forgotten sign in details. Past appointments will be available for you to view as well as upcoming appointments.

You do not have to do anything different, just log in as normal and you will be taken to the homepage where you will be able to see everything at a glance.



If you do not have an account with Patient Access, you can register online and book a single appointment. You will then need to come to Surgery with proof of ID and we will complete your registration to enable you to have full access.

**Please note, after 5 minutes of inactivity you will be signed out automatically to protect your account.**
